	Our traffic comes mainly (36%) from an organic search; direct access	
	from typing the name stunningstonehaven into the search bar is	
	32%, which suggests great brand awareness; social media sends us	
	27%; other website links give us 4.5%. Top referrals from other	
	websites are Visit Scotland 40%, Belvedere 11%, Mackie Academy	
	7% and Dunnottar Castle 6%.	
	There is a gap in the figures from Oct/Nov 2019 due to technical	
	issues so these figures are conservative.
